Looking to celebrate the veterans in your life? There are several events happening in the Tampa Bay area to commemorate Veterans Day, which falls on Nov. 11.

Something a little different happening the day of is an excursion planned by a group of area divers. They're hosting a Veterans Day tribute dive on the Circle of Heroes, an underwater military veterans memorial and recreational dive site located 10 miles off the coast of Honeymoon Island State Park. Dedicated in 2019, it comprises 13 6-foot-tall statues at a depth of 36 to 40 feet.

The statues depict Navy Sailor, Southeast Asia War Soldier, Korean War Soldier, Marine in Dress Blues, Vietnam Soldier, Air Force Pilot, No Man Left Behind, Gulf War Soldier, Iraq War Soldier, Iraq Freedom Fighter, Army Nurse, Soldier Kneeling & Battle Cross, and Coast Guard Sailor.
